AMA Health Systems Science Learning Series Update

The American Medical Association Health Systems Science Learning Series has recently updated all 13 modules in the series. These popular educational modules, which have been reworked to provide even greater utility and timely information, prepare future physicians and health care professionals to successfully work within health systems.

Important areas of interest that the recent content update effort has touched, include: **Building on clinical informatics and data analytics** to include AI and Big Data; **Identifying essential leadership behaviors** through a set of competencies that includes change management; **Explaining the intersection of medical ethics and law** from a systems perspective; **Providing strategies to achieve high value care** through a fivestep framework, which includes understanding the benefits, harms and relative costs of interventions; **Discussing how to improve health outcomes** by implementing population health; **Identify social determinants of health** during a patient encounter using the "five A's"—adjustment, assistance, alignment, advocacy and awareness.
