

A great monthly newsletter by Karim Hanna, MD at University of South Florida highlights innovations and applications of AI within medical education (<u>subscribe here</u>). In a recent issue, Dr. Hanna shared some of his favorite AI tools for physicians. These are free AI resources that can help with different aspects of clinical work BUT can also be used in learner interactions to foster discussion, critical thinking, or solve clinical problems.

- OpenEvidence (<u>OpenEvidence Ask</u>): A platform for quickly gathering evidence-based medical insights by utilizing AI to answer clinical questions
- Glass Health AI (<u>Glass Health AI</u>): Leverages AI to assist clinicians in developing differential diagnoses and treatment plans.
- Nabla (<u>https://www.nabla.com/</u>) and Heidi (<u>https://www.heidihealth.com/</u>): These AI scribe tools
  listen to conversations between physicians and patients, and transcribe relevant clinical information
  in real-time, allowing doctors to focus more on patient care and less on paperwork

ScholarRx is calling for grant applications as part of the Medical Education Research and Innovation Challenge (MERIC), a novel program designed to promote global educational scholarship and innovation. The MERIC small grants program will support health sciences education investigators seeking to collaborate with ScholarRx to test educational innovations and address questions ranging from educational methods and pedagogy to curricular development and student assessment. ScholarRx expects to fund 2-3 projects with budgets from \$5,000 to \$20,000 in this call.
