Resource: Advance Your Teaching Practice: Spring 2026 Advanced Teaching Certificate Program

The Advanced Teaching (AT) Certificate offers instructors an opportunity to deepen their pedagogical expertise and join a community dedicated to effective, learner-centered teaching. Through six in-person sessions (January 30; February 13, 20, 27; March 6, 20), classroom observations, and a Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) project, participants will strengthen their skills in course design, assessment, inclusive pedagogy, and instructional strategies. Completion of the Principles of Effective Teaching (PET) Certificate or facilitator approval is required.

Apply: Academic Medicine seeks associate editors

The AAMC peer-reviewed journal Academic Medicine is currently welcoming applications to expand the team of volunteer associate editors, who work collaboratively with the journal's editorial team, editorial staff, and manuscript authors and reviewers to shape the future of medical education through high-impact scholarship. Applications are currently being considered on a rolling basis, with a start date of January 1, 2026. The associate editor role is a one-year renewable appointment.

Apply: 2025 ScholarRx Call for Innovation Grant Applications

Deadline: December 12, 2025

ScholarRx is now accepting applications for the Medical Education Research and Innovation Challenge (MERIC), a small grants program supporting U.S. and international investigators who wish to collaborate with ScholarRx to study educational innovations across methods, curriculum, and assessment. The program expects to fund 2–3 projects with budgets typically ranging from \$2,500–\$5,000 (up to \$10,000 for exceptional proposals), with LOIs due December 12, 2025 and full proposal invitations and award dates following in early 2026.
