The Journal of Graduate Medical Education (JGME) has published a supplement focused on the work of American Medical Association Reimagining Residency grant program over the last five years. The peer reviewed articles in the supplement document the successes, challenges, and learnings that have resulted from the 11 Reimagining Residency projects. Rather than summarize each project in isolation, the leaders of these projects cooperated with one another to demonstrate how their individual and collaborative efforts have addressed common challenges in GME and achieved synergistic outcomes.

2025 Emerging Innovators Grants

2026 Stemmler Grants

Application Deadline: June 30, 2025

Targeting mid- and senior-career researchers, this grant supports innovative assessment techniques in medical education or practice. Up to \$150,000 will be awarded for each research team.

Apply: ABMS Visiting Scholars Program

Application Deadline: June 23, 2025

Applications are being accepted for the 2025-26 American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) Visiting Scholars program, a year-long, part-time program that supports the research of early-career physicians and researchers.
