Working with Joe Costello, Tony Artino, and Lauren Maggio, MedEdMentor developed the Medical Education Corpus (MEC), a dataset of 119,000 medical education papers using their own machine learning model outperforming PubMed's MeSH. Now, at MedEdMentor, they're building the MedEdMentor Paper Database with community-driven improvements and are seeking testers for early 2025—learn more in their blog post!

months of discussion and research, the committee has released a vision framework for community input, guiding future projects and resource development—your feedback is encouraged!

Read and Review: Al in Medical Education: 5 Ways Schools are Employing New Tools

Artificial intelligence is being tapped to create quizzes, simulate patients, pinpoint student struggles, and write assessments. Human oversight is critical. Medical schools are gradually integrating AI into education through pilot programs, such as AI-generated test questions in Ohio, AI-assisted residency evaluations in Florida, and AI-simulated clinical visits in Texas and Minnesota. These innovations aim to enhance efficiency and effectiveness in medical training, with experts emphasizing the need for careful implementation and assessment.
