Reflection Activities

- Journaling
- Ask learners to reflect on the learning objectives. Did they meet them? Progress toward them?
- “Three takeaways” assignment
- What would they do differently?
- How will they apply information in the future?
- Can be personal or shared
- Doesn't have to be written. Can use audio/video







Minimize Distractions

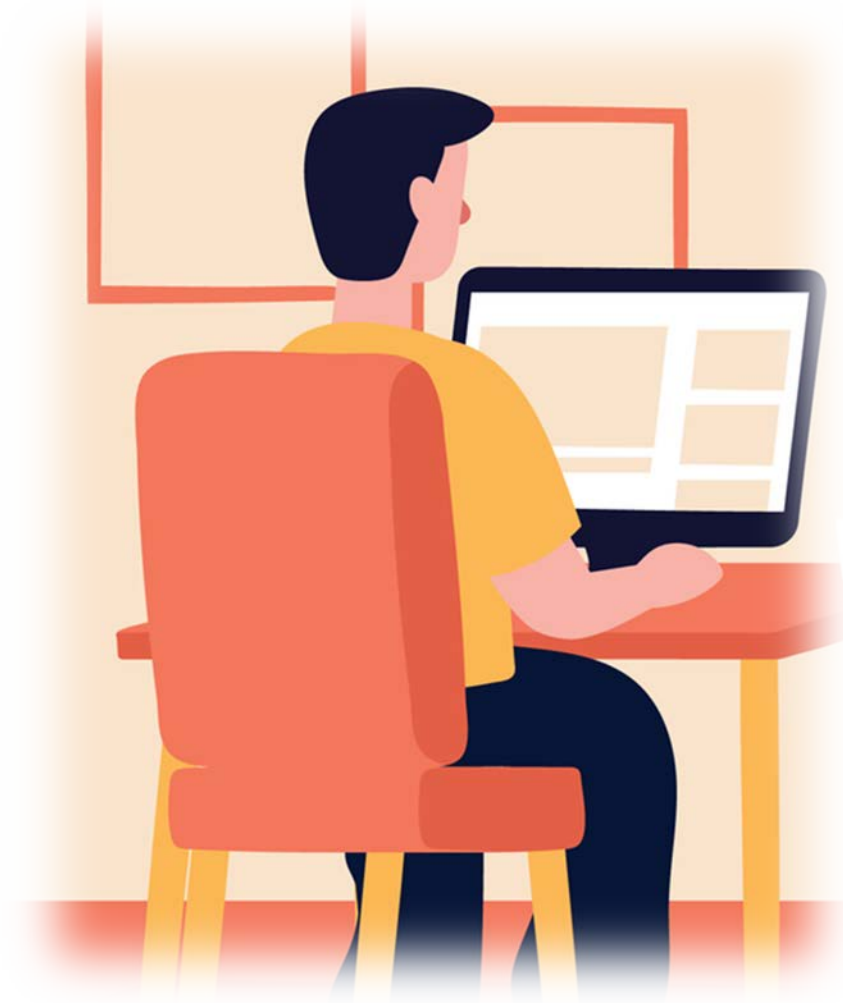
- Smaller chunks of learning
- Get them doing something!
- Shorter activities
- Require students to regularly ask questions and respond to their peers.
- Make a schedule and stick to it.
- Timely assessments

Questions to Ask Yourself



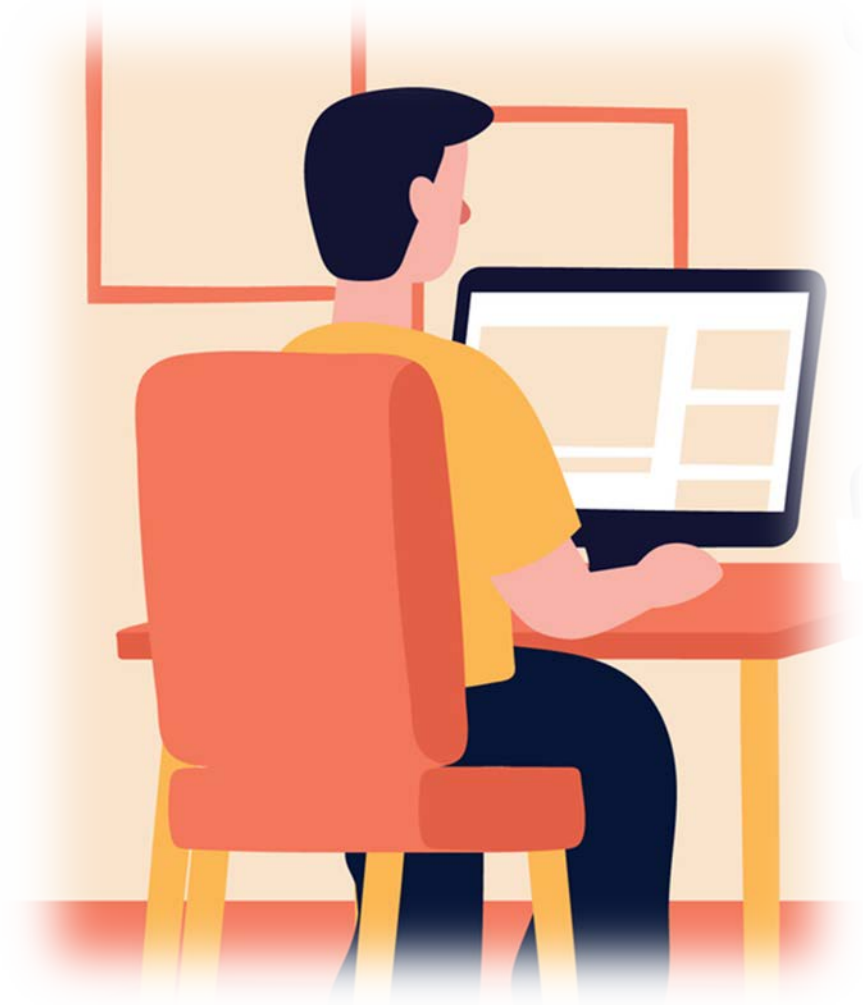
Questions to Ask Yourself

- What new factors must you consider in your course design and teaching and what elements of classroom practice can you maintain?
- What specific strengths and limitations for online delivery are linked to your subject matter?
- What changes to assessment do you need to make?



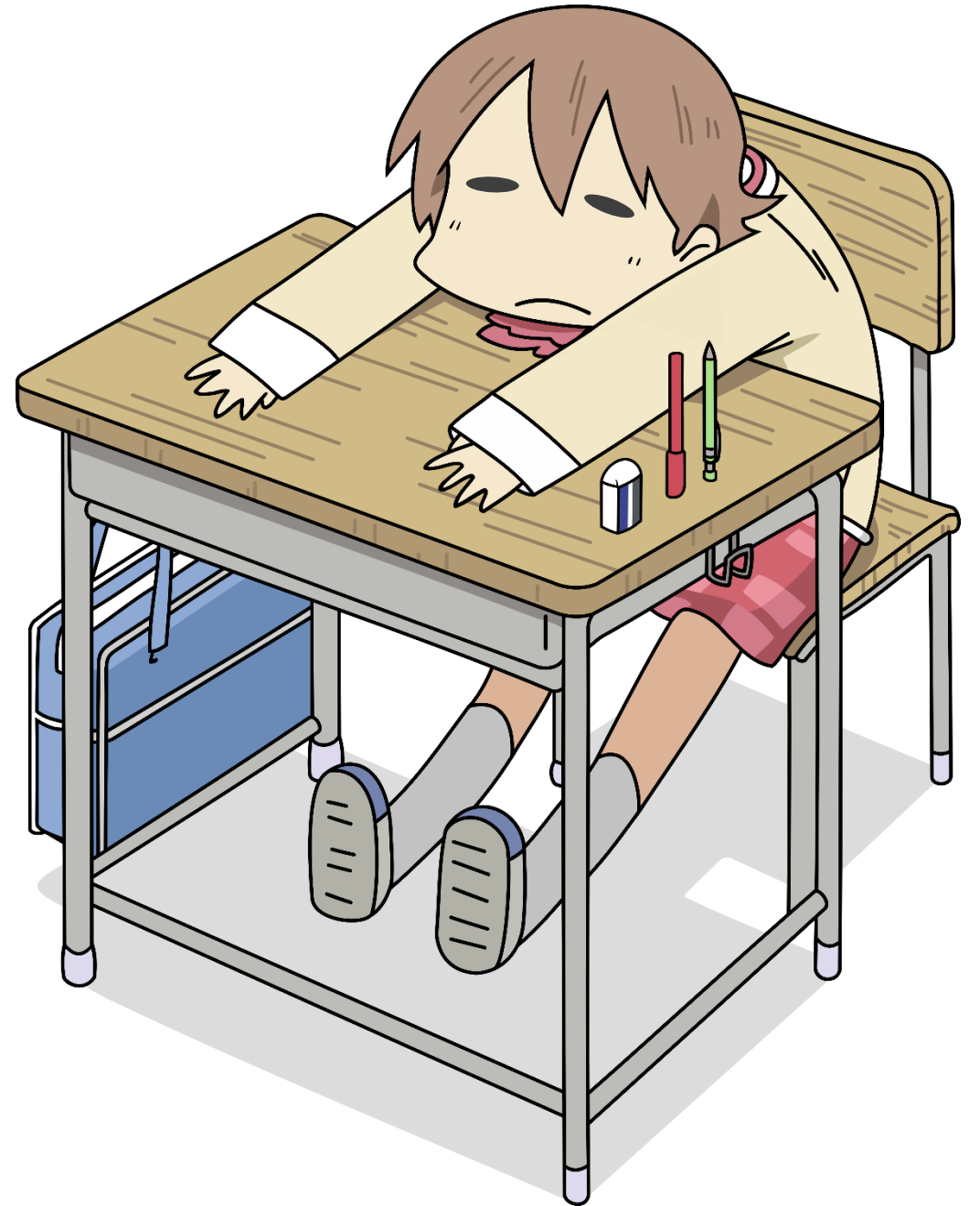
Questions to Ask Yourself

- What technologies will you use?
- Do your learners have limits to access, use of technology, and their technological skills which may impact their learning?
- How will you support your learners?



Don't be Boring

- Don't just read slides.
- Use script as a guide.
- Avoid monotone.
- Be conversational.

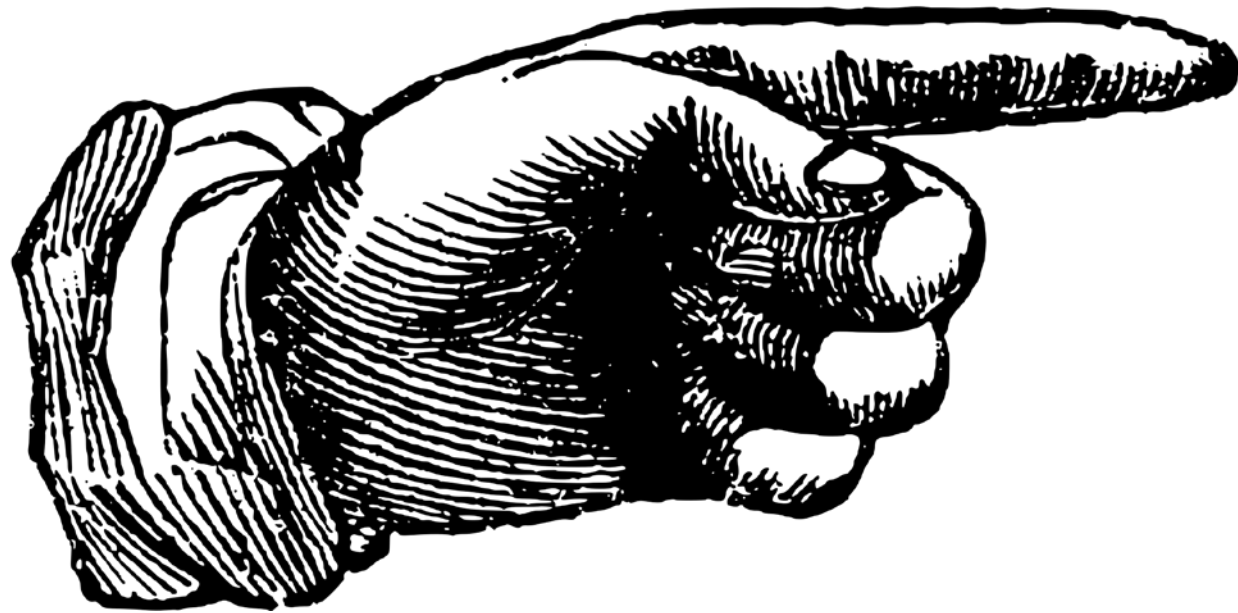

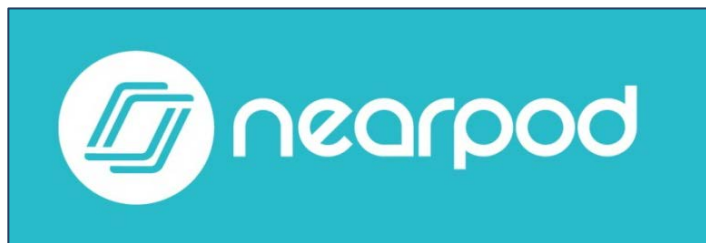
